





Fermentation techniques are more productive/faster/more efficient than traditional growing seasonal crops

Preference

Nutriepigenomics explains how functional foods influence epigenetic modifications both histone modifications and Non-coding RNAs of the human genome while regulating health and disease. Epigenetics is dynamic the study of heritable meiotic and miotic changes in gene expression and repression functionalities that are not resultant of changes in DNA sequence; the structural epigenetic modifications that effect chromosomal histone-complex or nucleosomal tail methylation and acetylation are involved in tissue specific patterns that register and signal heritable gene expression without sequential DNA modifications.

The objectives are to introduce to the reader Nutrition, functional foods and Epigenetics with explanations of associated quantum theory and biological concepts throughout the text. There is a hypothesis within: Quantum field biological interactions and Pseudocertainty on epigenetics. Introduction

Epigenetics is the study of heritable and dynamic meiotic and miotic changes in gene expression and repression functionalities that are not resultant of changes in DNA sequence, the structural chromosomal modifications that effect histone complex methylation and acetylation are dynamic, involved in tissue specific patterns that register and signal heritable gene expression without sequential DNA modifications. Thus, epigenetic interactions are not always heritable as dynamic interactions of epigenetic clock reversal and biomarkers correction overtime is achievable via functional foods, food supplements and even future gene editing.

Nutritional micronutrients and functional foods have an effect via epigenetic histone modifications which do not directly affect DNA structure. Epigenetic control of gene expression constitutes three biological systems: Histone modifications, DNA methylation, and noncoding RNA repression. whereby effectors, effect the octamer histone protein amino tails that help to form a supportive nucleosol hairpin structure for the coiled DNA as shown in following text. Some external and internal environmental factors on epigenetics switch gene expression off via Methyl-groups, or on via acetyl-groups, with later discourse and further detail.

Maternal and nutritional epigenetic programming is inheritable, both intergenerational and transgenerational epigenetic inheritance, although when **gene biomarkers are in a <u>poised state</u>** genes are not expressed known as gene silencing. Therefore, functional foods combined with healthy lifestyle choices limits undesirable gene expression, further explained as follows.

Internal and external environmental factors on Epigenetics

Pollutants such as Bisphenol, Phthalates, Pesticides and metals... are environmental factors that have impact on both histone epigenetic alterations and genome DNA mutations; most environmental pollutants are detrimental to optimal health although debatably accepted and tolerated if the pollutants are within 'recommended levels', histone epigenetic modifications are often modified due to pollutants although antioxidants assist to diminish the detrimental free radicals. Plastics, adhesives, solvents and personal care products are all phthalates, and metals (cadmium, chromium, lead, nickel and zinc...) all have many dangerous and decremental transgenerational effects that are mostly not reversible, though synthetic biology may assist in the future with gene editing and other sustainable environmental solutions.

Gamma particles from the sun are normally filtered by stratospheric ozone (between 15-25km high), though chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) have caused ozone-depletion $(O_3 \rightarrow O_2)$ and the consequential gamma particles are often involved in epigenomic hypermethylation modifications of the skin; though vitamin D is synthesized with sunlight, discouragement with respect to sunbathing is advisable in avoidance of undesirable modifications. Other pollutants and toxins have effects on epigenetic activation and repression of gene expression and immunity, examples would be oxidative damage that occurs during metabolism because oxygen is a radical with two unpaired electrons that spin in the same direction during metabolism. Homeostasis of the oxidants, antioxidants and redox status should complete otherwise consequential imbalance occurs. This physiological unbalance is addressed through intake of nutritional antioxidants, i.e., Vitamin A, C and selenium dependent glutathione and other antioxidant enhancing functional foods.

Functional foods

The National Academy of Sciences' Food and Nutrition Board cites those functional foods is "any modified food or food ingredient that may provide a health benefit beyond the traditional nutrients it contains" (Earl R, Thomas PR (eds) (1994), and the International Life Sciences Institute cites "foods that, by virtue of the presence of physiologically-active components, provide a health benefit beyond basic nutrition". The American Dietetic Association definition of functional foods cites the same as above and acknowledges foods that are "whole, fortified, enriched, or enhanced," and consumed "as part of a varied diet on a regular basis, at effective levels" for imparting health benefits to consumers (Thomson C et al - 1999) Thus functional foods are enhanced and fortified which provide health benefits with regular nutritional value towards optimal health when taken in regular specified quantity, functional foods are considered similar to genetically modified products wherein are fortified with additional nutritional benefit of preventive measure against several diseases in order to treat the medical conditions (Weststrate JA et al -2002).

Functional foods are an important source in the prevention, management, and treatment of diseases, functional foods can be natural, processed or engineered bio functional foods that contain known bioactive micronutrients; defined as foods that have additional functions via insertion of new ingredients or enhancement of existing ingredients of existing products. Developing new food products, similar in appearance to conventional food items, and/or bio-functional foods, whereby risks of chronic disease could be reduced beyond the basic nutritional functional functional functional functional foods.

Sources of Functional Foods are categorized as naturally derived products and/or industrially synthesized products; naturally occurring functional foods can be subdivided into plant-derived or from animal sources. Functional foods include oats, flaxseeds, cruciferous vegetables, citrus fruits, garlic, tea, grapes, wine, etc. and animal-derived foods include egg, meat, fish, milk, curd, cheese. Industrial products include nutraceuticals and chemically or synthesized or engineered functional foods utilising synthetic biology and nanotechnology. Chemically, flavonoids are formed of a $C_6-C_3-C_6$ structure, that consists of two benzene rings linked by a three carbon chains which form an oxygenated heterocyclic carbon ring. The classes of flavonoids, divided in according to their chemical structures: - flavanones, flavones, dihydroflavonols, flavonols, flavan 3 - ols, flavanols - including monomers, proanthocyanidins, and other flavanolderived compounds.

Flavonoids are scavengers for radicals (or electrons), and are **anti-inflammatory**, **anti-thrombotic**, help receptor enzyme system and also have inhibitory effects on cyclic-oxygenase and lipoxygenase, and Xanthine oxidase and Aldose reductase inhibitor, flavonoids and non-flavonoid (trans-resveratrol) are also **antioxidants** that help to reduce high levels of undesirable saturated fats and cholesterol in the bloodstream. Flavonoids have benefits of anti-inflammatory protecting cells from oxidative damage (and/or senescence), these dietary antioxidants if combined with the *precursor to NAD+* (*nicotinamide adenine dinucleotide*)) are preventive of the development of cardiovascular disease, diabetes, cancer, and cognitive diseases i.e., Alzheimer and dementia via reduction of neurological electron leakage (Garland et le. 2008) and antitumor anti-inflammatory, longevity via activation of **SIRT1** nucleic enzyme (also see appendix, I).

Saponins '

Saponins are an important part of functional foods with many health benefits towards optimal healthy ageing. Saponins are steroid, triterpenoid glycosides, common in a large number of plants and plant products. Several biological effects have been ascribed to saponins, research in the membrane, immune stimulant, hypo-cholesterolaemic and anti-carcinogenic properties. These structurally diverse compounds have also been observed to inhibit protozoan also to have the analgesic, anti-nociceptive, antioxidant activity, anti-fungal and antiviral agents. Saponins can form protein complexes with unknown effects when combined with proteins i.e., casein from milk also saponins can disrupt digestion of cholesterol and saturated fats (see Table 2, 3, 4).

Isothiocyanates are compounds produced by several plants that belong to the Brassicaceae, Capparaceae and Caricaceae families, such as Brussel sprouts, garden cress, kale, mustard greens, turnip greens, cabbage, broccoli, watercress, cauliflower horseradish, Japanese radish and cauliflower, all these vegetables significantly contribute to cancer chemo preventive activity.

Isothiocyanates are rich sources of Sulphur containing compounds called glucosinolates and are a system of physiological defense against pathogen attack. People who consume more than four portions of cruciferous vegetables per week appear to have a lower incidence of diseases (Fahey JW – 2001, Hecht SS et al - 2004) These effects appear to be associated with diets rich in fruit and vegetables. Isothiocyanates are the chemical components that occur in cruciferous vegetables that mediate healthy ageing (see table 5 & 6).

Isothiocyanates are derived from the hydrolysis of glucosinolates by the enzyme myrosinase during the conversion of glucosinolates to isothiocyanates. Glucosinolates are thioglycosides that comprise of glycone moiety and a variable glycone-side-chains derived from one of a small number of amino acids. Amino acids accumulate in vegetative members of the Brassicales which include cruciferous vegetables; When plant tissues are damaged or stressed an endogenous plant thioglucosidase, commonly known as myrosinase cleaves the glucosinolate molecule, resulting in the generation of isothiocyanates.

Each glucosinolate forms a different isothiocyanate when hydrolyzed, broccoli is a good source of glucoraphanin. The glucosinolate precursor of sulforaphane. Isothiocyanates are derived from **mustard oil** (2-propenyl-isothiocyanates) and in the herb **wasabi** there is 4-methyl-sulphinylbutyl isothiocyanates (or sulforaphane). And in **Broccoli** - phenethyl-isothiocyanates and in **watercress**; and 3-butenyl-isothiocyanates within **Chinese cabbage** (Wilson et al - 1973) Isothiocyanates conjugate with glutathione leading to induction of oxidative stress and translocation of NRF2 from the cytoplasm to the nucleus and the resultant transcription of **antioxidant** helps gene expression (Fahey JW et al 2012, Verkerk R, et al - 2019)

There is accumulating evidence of isothiocyanatestes impact towards optimal health and healthy ageing and the usage of isothiocyanates towards cancer prevention *(not a cure)*. Moderate quantities of Broccoli, wasabi, Chinese cabbage, Kale and mustard oil *(see table 5 & 6 and appendix I)*.

activity was reduced in blood cells following ingestion of 68g (one cup) of sulforaphane-rich broccoli sprouts (see Table 5). Isothiocyanates may also affect microRNA-mediated gene silencing though further research is necessary *(Abbaoui B*)

Allyl Sulfides Organosulfur (allyl sulfides) compounds found in allium vegetables such as <u>garlic</u> <u>and onions</u> which are known anti-carcinogenic agents. Allyl sulfides increase the production of glutathione S-transferase

Garlic also contain <u>phyto</u>chemicals (especially if stressed), such as quercetin and allyl sulfides, which are linked to cardiovascular health, immunity function ..., also total white blood cell count has been enhanced significantly with moderate intake of garlic.

Allyl sulfides are more powerful inducers than the methyl or propyl derivatives, and within the allyl series, the disulfide is a more potent inducer than the monosulfide. Thiosulfonates are allylsulfide compounds including allicin, diallyldisulfide (DADs), diallyl sulfide (DAS), diallyl trisulfide, Sallylmercaptocysteine, S-allylcysteineallyl and methyl sulfide (see figure 1b & 1c)

Garlic derived DADS and DATS influenced anaerobic cysteine metabolism, elevating the activity of enzymes involved in the normal kidneys. DATS inhibits ALDH activity in the kidneys, showing a new pharmacological property of garlic derived allyl trisulfide. ALDH inhibition can lead to an increase concentration of aldehydes, the toxicity of which could be used in the reduction of senescent cells.


Figure 1a - the DNA coils around the octamer/nucleosome core complexes which are bound firmly with DNA for gene repression.

Garlic-derived allyl sulfides relates to sulfane Sulphur metabolism or with ALDH activity though further studies are required. Garlic-derived allyl sulfides and enzymes involved with the synthesis and biodegradation of H2S again further research on catalytic activity, and protein antibody level, and on gene expression is required; Allyl sulfides make alterations in cholesterol, arachidonic acid, phospholipids and thiols account for changes in membrane functionality. Allyl sulfides are recognized for ability to suppress cellular proliferation by the induction of apoptosis (see figure 1b & 1c and Appendix I).

Allyl sulfides derived from garlic have the ability of to suppress tumor proliferation both in vitro and in vivo. This anti-neoplastic effect is greater for lipid-soluble than watersoluble, concentration and duration of exposure will increase effects of lipid- and water solubility, may relate to an increase in membrane fluidity and suppression of integrin glycoprotein mediated adhesion. This increased histone acetylation,

Carotenoids are especially abundant in yellow-orange fruits and vegetables and in dark green, leafy vegetables. Though carotenoids are also found in animal derived products e.g., dairy products, eggs, some fish and seafood.

Vitamin A is an important micronutrient within functional foods as carotenoids are mainly present in plants. Provitamin A activity exerted by some carotenoids, influences diverse molecular and cellular processes, involved in risk reduction of several chronic diseases; these are certain types of cancers, cardiovascular disease, type 2 diabetes, age-related macular degeneration and cataracts and other diseases.

The above probiotics (or bio-cultures) are an important part of immunity and have a reconstruction effect in the gut, also assists in cellular metabolism and blood calcium levels and bile metabolism, also the synthesis of vitamins. This improves immunity, and the nerve system, and endocrine system and enhancement of glycemic control; all of which effect the epigenetics in a positive way (Tonucci LB et al - 2017) towards optimal healthy ageing. Similar probiotics are incorporated into foods i.e., bioyogurt and fermented milk, cheese, and fruit-based drinks. The mechanism of gut microbiota ameliorates intestinal wall permeability for healthier mineral absorption providing fibrous prebiotics is also included (see functional foods and Bio-Functionalfoods letter within appendix III)

Application of nanotechnology in food science utilizing a delivery system for encapsulating, protecting, and controlling the release of micronutrients via functional foods towards optimal health with benefits to reduce the risk of chronic diseases. Examples of nutraceuticals are natural foods, including antioxidants, dietary supplements, fortified dairy products, and citrus fruits, and vitamins, minerals, herbals, milk, and cereals.

Future functional foods will be nanoparticles that are biological molecules found naturally in certain foods that provide physiological benefits thereby diminishing the risks of many diseases. The reduced particle size that nanotechnology provides improve properties of biological molecules, improvement of delivery, solubility, prolonged gastrointestinal time, and efficient cellular absorption

The majority of functional food nanoparticles conventionally were the colloid group (i.e., co-enzymes); the stabilization of colloidal particles is achieved via adsorbing surfactants and polymers and by coating the nanoparticles with chemically bonding molecules.

Micro emulsions are thermodynamically stable systems, formed spontaneously when surfactants and other biological components are added to water under the right environmental conditions. Generally, the new functional bioactive foods consist of micronutrients inside nanoparticles. Utilizing surfactants, lipids and carbohydrates; all compacted in a small particle size of < 500 nm. These new functional foods will include improved bioavailability, centrifugal separation, greater stability, and higher optical clarity (Momin et al., 2013; Joye et al., 2014; Sekhon, 2010).

Nutriments are often lost during processing or storage of food because of the enzymatically unstable nature of many of the micronutrients that are incorporated into food products The stability of micronutrients is important and a successful delivery system would incorporate micronutrients within functional foods while release in the bioactive form upon consumption of food for digestion.

The design and production of food-grade nanoparticles that food manufacturers may utilize to develop effective micronutrient is a potential resource for encapsulating and enhancement and stability, functionality, and bioavailability of micronutrients for functional foods and food packaging. Several applications of nanotechnologies have become apparent with usage of nanoparticles, such as liposomes, nano-emulsions, biopolymeric nanoparticles, and cubosomes, as well as the development of <u>nano-</u> <u>sensors</u>, with the objective of ensuring food safety **Nasr, Nasr.** (2015)

Lipid-based nano-encapsulation systems boost antioxidant performance, enhancing solubility and bioavailability for manufactures the principal lipid-based nano-

encapsulation systems with potential use in food and nutraceutical industries. Thus, nanotechnology offers food technologists new opportunities to innovate in encapsulation and controlled release of food materials, as well as providing enhanced bioavailability, stability, and shelf life for sensitive ingredients (Mozafari et al., 2012). Nano-encapsulation packaging is advantageous in developing designer probiotic bacterial preparations with the potential for locating gastrointestinal tract where the probiotics/bio-cultures interact with specific receptors. The health-enhancing properties of polyphenols have attracted much attention in recent years. A milk-based protein has been used to prepare oil-in-water, sodium caseinate stabilized nano-emulsions. The immobilization of fat droplets, composed of high melting temperature milk fat triglycerides, has provided protection against packaged nutrient degradation and enhance food flavor and texture, to reduce fat content, or to encapsulate nutrients, such as vitamins, and increase functionality and stability (*Wai-Yee Fung, Kay-Hay Yuen, and Min-Tze Liong - 2011*).

A brief introduction to Epigenetics

Nutriepigenomics reveal how diet determine *epigenetic modifications both histone and Non-coding RNAs of the human genome regulating both to health and disease.* Histone modifications is the mechanism by which methylation and acetylation of histone tails regulates the epigenetic cellular system.

Each of the eight histone proteins make an octamer (see figure 1a & 1b), and a combination of post-translational modifications (methylation and acetylation) occur at sites on the nucleosol histone-core tails. Although other modifications occur, phosphorylation, Sumoylation, ubiquitylation(Ub), GlcNAcylation, citrullination, krotonilation, and isomerization. The later three are more recent discoveries, these modifications add or remove from histone amino acid residues via a set of enzymatic reactions.

Post-translational modifications (PTMs) of histone-tails have resultant changes in chromatin that may induce and increase or decrease in DNA-histone affinity (*udali S, Guarini et al - 2013*) an increase of DNA-histone affinity results in transcriptional repression the opposite results with relaxation of the DNA coils around the histone proteins for gene expression. Histone methylation *normally is on arginine, lysine, and histone residues; the magnitude and location determines transcriptional activation or repression of gene expression (see figure 1a & 1b).*







Figure 1b shows graphical representation and x-ray diffraction analysis (front and side orientation) of the nucleosome and histone tails providing access for transcription, mostly controlled by histone proteins. the nucleosome consists of an octamer made of two subunits contain four historie proteins: H2A, H2B, H3, and H4. (With tails) that is a total of eight histone proteins, 2 tetramers (H2-H4) and 2 (H2A-H2B) dimers in the histone/octamer core complex. The ammo acid linker proteins – H1 etc.... functions to bind and stabilize inter-nucleosol DNA, the linker DNA joins octamer together to make the nucleosome; the histone proteins undergo post-translational (PTM) and post transcriptional modifications in different ways (some are salt dependent). Some histone modifications disrupt nucleosol DNA interactions, thereby the nucleosomes unwind or relax for gene expression.

The process of Acetylation unbinds the DNA loosely around the octamer so that gene expression can occur, the chromatin fibre consists of DNA wound around histone protein complexes that is the nucleosome coiled into the hairpin structure chromatin fiber; acetylation of histories effect how accessible the DNA is for repression or expression, that is for gene expression (see figure 1b).

Histone modifications 🥏 🍃

Histone modifications HTMs are diverse, including phosphorylation, methylation, acetylation, ubiquitylation and during meiotic spermatogenic cell division most haploid genome are misplaced by protamine, though not all some are retained so to transmit genetic information to the progeny. However, histone modifications are implicated with cell senescence, cancer, cardiovascular disease, obesity diabetes and many other epigenetic modifications.

Histone methylation can activate or suppress gene expression in accordance to different lysine dependent states (i.e. Mono-methyl, Di-methyl, or Tri-methyl states; the demethylated function is in reverse (relaxes the DNA coils) on the histone-tails during transcription. There are seven transcriptional regulatory core histone modifications on the H3 histone-tail that is:- 2 active promoters (H3K9ac, H3K4me3), 2 enhancer promoters (H3K4me1 (stem cell line), H3K27ac), 1 transcribed gene bodies (H3K36me3), 1 polycomb promoters (H3K27me3), 1 heterochromatin (H3K9me3) it is possible to define chromatin profile status (biomarkers) of the 29/04/21



modifications with Histone-tails, showing the modifications are transactional epigenetic markers that undergo events via: Acetylation(Ac), methylation(Me), Phosphorylation(P), ubiquitylation(Ub) all are necessary to allow activity of the chromatin remodelling complex.

Methylation activates or represses gene expression depending on which residue is methylated; Methylation of histone methyltransferases (HMTs), of Lysine SET domain containing (histone tails) and Non-SET domain containing histone cores. All of the above modifications **add or remove** from histone proteins amino acid residues via a set of enzymatic reactions (see figure 1c & 1d, appendix, I, II)

Mechanisms of nutrition on epigenetics

Three epigenetic mechanisms: **DNA methylation**, **histone modification**, and **non-coding RNA** that is involved in gene silencing.

The nutritional variables that effect the function of the epigenome are biological molecules of vitamins, minerals and herbs that have epigenetic benefit diminishing the onset of illness; achieved via epigenetic enhancement during histone acetylation of the HAT enzymes occurs on the ε-amino lysine residue. Histone acetyltransferase (HAT) inhibits gene expression, and the HDAC enzyme, histone deacetylase (HDAC) enables gene expression. Thus, HAT and HDAC are involved in control gene expression switching gene expression off (methyl- groups) or on (acetyl- groups) via structural histones and histone-tails that compress the DNA for repression and uncoil the DNA for gene expression. HAT and HDAC are reversible epigenetic modifications that nutritional molecules are effectors. Each histone octamer is wrapped by 147 bp of DNA to form a nucleosome, the spacing between each basepair (bp) varies between 30 and 100 and can be modified by nucleosome repositioning complexes. DNA methylation regulates gene expression via the addition of a methyl group on the 5' position on the pyrimidine ring of the nucleotide, this methylation occurs on the amino acid cytosine flanked by a guanine that yields a 5'-cytosinephosphate-guanine-3'(CpG) methylation. Also, methylation occurs on the cytosine neighbouring other nucleotides for non-CpG methylation.

Approximately 5% of cytosines are methylated at the global level, with hypermethylation observed in areas of hetero-chromatin and hypo-methylation. High densities of CpG sites are localized to repetitive DNA, specifically the localization of methyl-cytosines in relation to the gene and the density of CpG islands.

DNA methylation occurs at CpG sites though most of the genome is CpG poor, there are segments of 300-3000 bp with a 65% observed to expected ratio of CpG sites that are called CpG islands (CGIs). The CpG islands are localized to the promoter region of 70% of human genes, including tissue-specific genes, and developmentally regulated genes vital for stem cells due to distinctive topology that is reprogrammed with the gametes. DNA methylation is regulated via DNA methyltransferases (DNMT) there is DNMT 1, DNMT 3a, DNMT 3b though DNMT 1 is predominant in humans (Duygu et al 2013 - also see Appendix, I, II).

DNA methylation function is to transfer a methyl group (CH3–) to 5' end of the DNA (cytosine) sequence via DNMTs and S-adenosyl methionine (SAM) as the methyl group donor, cytosine is adjoining to the guanine residue refired to as CpG inland. Gene sequencing is enriched at CpG and if present in the gene promoter region transcriptional repression will occur, however if present on the exon region transcriptional activation will occur (udali S, Guarini - 2013, Mazzio EA et al – 2012).

DNA demethylation

There are various pathways for **DNA demethylation** and the **passive** removal of a methyl group (CH3) of 5-mC, during de-methylation 5-mC is demethylated for cellular division during mitosis for replication; however active de-methylation occurs with non-replicating neurons. DNA demethylation is the process of removal of a methyl group from cytosines. DNA demethylation can be passive or active. The passive process takes place in the absence of methylation of newly synthesized DNA strands by DNMT1 during several replication cycles.

DNA Hydroxy methylation

The ten-eleven transferase (TET) enzyme catalyzes an oxidation reaction that converts 5-methylcytosinein to 5-hydroxymethylcytosine before subsequent steps that ultimately yield an unmodified cytosine (see figure 1f). Regions of hydroxy methylated DNA are considered to be sites of active demethylation and have been associated with an increase in gene expression (Tammen et al., 2015). In the presence of a hydroxy-methyl group on the 5 position of cytosine in CpG dinucleotides is a biomarker, considered a transient step in active demethylation of DNA.

Non-coding RNAs are small nucleolar RNAs, ribosomal RNAs, long regulatory noncoding RNAs(IncRNAs), microRNAs, small interfering RNAs(siRNAs) and piwiinteracting(piRNAs) RNAs and other regulatory RNAs involved in functional tissue specificity that are nucleic transcriptional and intergenerational signalling for © copyright (2021) John Lawrence King All Rights Reserved 29/04/21

inheritable phenotype. The microRNAs are transcribed and folded into a hairpin structure and cleaved via a DROSHA complex the resultant hairpin precursor premiRNA is transported from the nucleus to the cytoplasm via exportin-5 and unites with a Dicer complex to become a mature microRNA. A negative regulatory RNA-inducing silencing complex (RISC) results with degradation of the mRNA sequence, thus regulating protein synthesis; also important in post transcriptional regulation of many diseases. MicroRNAs can be utilized as epigenetic biomarkers for various cancer

Environmental factors can remodel epigenomic somatic tissues and sperm of which is dynamic and vulnerable to internal and external environmental changes. During spermatogenesis DNA modifications are erased, reconstructed and the histones are replaced via arginine-rich protamine in the sperm. The fundamental question of how parental diet and lifestyle alter epigenetic phenotype and perhaps behaviour, other mechanistic signals transfer environmental and epigenetic fluctuations.

mtDNA that is encoded on the X chromosome inherited on the maternal side, if the maternal is showing obesity, the slow metabolic biomarkers are not always expressed if the recipient is in acknowledgement of functional foods and participates in regular physical exercise. Histone acetylation (Ac) occurs on the ε-amino lysine residue and promotes DNA unfolding – CoA (acetyl coenzyme A) and lysine where HAT (histone) acetyltransferase enzyme, inhibits gene expression - i.e., repression for immunological defence) and HDAC (histone deacetylase enzyme, HDAC enables nucleic gene expression), n-butyrate is a HDAC inhibitor where HATs are coactivators during transcription. HATs categories are: GCN5, MYST(MOZ), P300/CBP and SRC/p160 of the nuclear receptor co-activator family. Histone and non-histone proteins are catalysed via HATs. Reversible histone acetylation catalysed via HATs and HDATs also histone acetylation can inhibit H1-mediated salt insolubility assisting salt solubility concentrations that effects binding and relaxation of DNA coils on the hairpin nucleosome structure. Thus, HATS and HDAC are involved in the control gene expression switching gene expression off or on. This effect is consistent with the expected large reduction in electron density on the amino nitrogen upon acetylation thus, making coordination with the coenzyme copper much less strong; the structure of histones shows the patterns of histone acetylation and methylation are quite precise and important mechanisms for epigenetic alteration of gene expression (See figure 1c & 1d and appendix, I)

Functional foods are bioactive and help to prevent degenerative conditions such as Alzheimer disease, molecular degenerative disease, encephalopathy, arthritis... (list is exhausting) are internal physiological factors that affect genetic(indirectly) and directly epigenetic modifications; caused by the onset of cell senescence/ageing, though effect can be reduced in favour of healthy ageing with appropriate nutrition. Functional foods and Bio-functional-foods also incorporates all micronutrients and microfauna and microflora know as **microbiota**. Microbiota may be derived from fibrous nutrients together with probiotics in bioyogurt, algae and other functional foods. with adequate fibrosus nutrition, obesity related metabolic diseases may be reduced via the HDAC biological dependent pathways via repression or expression of genes (see figure 1d, and appendixes).

Providing nutritional intake is adequate, Vitamins, minerals, herbal supplements and micronutrients within functional foods will enhance epigenetic modifications and immunity shall function with reduction of toxins and oxidants, i.e. vitamins A, D and green tea are good examples of antioxidants. The nutritional benefits of fresh and functional foods containing multi vitamins, minerals and herbs are beneficial towards optimal health and healthy ageing. Essential Vitamins A, B2, B6, B9, B12, C, D, E, K... and selenium dependent glutathione and other antioxidants i.e... Trans-Resveratrol also the precursor NAD+, sirtuins and other enhancing nutrients together with bio-cultures will assist towards optimal healthy ageing.

Vitamin C is not produced in-vitro to the physiology therefore daily consumption is important. Vitamin C assist with the regulation of collagen synthesis and essential in bone formation, maintenance of healthy gums, and wound healing there has been suggestions for vitamin C treatment as preventative usage for: influenza, upper respiratory tract infections, diabetes, cataracts, glaucoma, macular degeneration, atherosclerosis, stroke, heart disease and even cancer (*Traber et al 2011*) vitamin C is noted as a co-factor for histone modifications and reduces oxidative stress and also is neuro-protective and cancer chemo preventative (*Li, P.et al – 2004*).

Polyunsaturated fats are healthy - Unsaturated fats and saturated fats refer to the quantity of hydrogen within the lipid structure of the fat, saturated fats comprise of many hydrogen bonds that are less healthy than unsaturated referred to as polyunsaturated fats that are Omiga-3 fatty acids and omiga-6 fatty acids (see table 11). A high fat diet of saturated animal derived fats **changes histone-tail modifications in unwanted ways at the gluconeogenic gene loci**; Were as the he

High intake of arachidonic acid metabolically diminishes the uptake of the healthier omega-3 fatty acids thus, plant derivative fatty acids are more desirable. Iron is essential mineral for enzymic reactions in all organisms; consumption is naturally via cereals, soybeans, lentils, Spinach and other plant micronutrients that aid towards optimal health and healthy ageing. Iron is a metabolic catalytic co-enzyme that is stored in the liver, important in haemoglobin for oxygen transportation via the red blood cells. Iron is important in mitochondria for adenosine triphosphate production during aerobic respiration and other metabolic processes. The iron dependent epigenetic enzyme histone acetyltransferase (see figure 1a & b) facilitates opening of the chromatin gene promoter regions of DNA to enable gene expression. Iron is involved with haemoglobin, phagocytotic white blood cells that assist immunity and diminishes oxidative stress among other functionalities such as the epigenetic regulation of gene expression.

has an preventive effect with respect to chronic diseases such as muscular dystrophy (Hogue et al - 1958) and other undesirable histone modifications due to selenium deficiency; quite often natural food sources do not incorporate adequate selenium due to nutrient-poor-soils, food supplements are advisable via a reasonable multi vitamin and mineral supplement or some other bio-functional foods that incorporates Selenium.

Garlic incorporates DADS (Diallyl Disulfide) that are inhibitors of HDAC (histone deacetylase enzyme, which enables gene expression), 40-60% Diallyl Disulfide is found in garlic of which is metabolize in the liver to inhibitory Allyl Nercaptan (AN) enzyme garlic lowers cholesterol and inhibits platelet aggregation and helps towards optimal health.

Other functional foods that are bioactive nutrient such as Broccoli, cabbage and kale incorporate Sulforaphane which are endogenous antioxidants that help prevent cancer and other health benefits. Green Tea incorporate flavonoid polyphenols, catechin and eipgalloatechin-3-gallate (EGCG) that are biological effectors; The EGCGs (50-70% in green tea) inhibit HATS (histone acetyltransferase enzyme) that inhibit unhealthy gene expression. It has also been shone that EGCG reduce HDAC activity in prostate cancer via the LNCap cells and PC-3 cells, that's suppression of class 1 histone deacetylases carcinogenesis (Thakur, v.s et al - 2005) Green tea has desirable epigenetic effect due to 50-70% EGCGs (see figure 1c & 1d, and appendixes).

Turmeric incorporates curcumin which is a polyphenolic compound that has epigenetic effect; curcumin is an antioxidant that utilizes acetyl-CoA and is a HAT inhibitor. Turmeric is anti-inflammatory due to the HAT inhibiting p300/CBP and HDAC activities (see figure 1b, 1c & 1d) of which, induce anti-inflammatory and anticancer effect (Sharma, et al - 2012). Turmeric also has preventive properties for poor intestinal absorption and preventive properties for type two diabetes via improvement of pancreatic beta-cells functionality. Turmeric is derived from the root rhizomes of the species curcuma longa, that is a member of the ginger classification (see personalized functional foods and Bio-functional-foods).

Alcohol effects on epigenetics

Alcohol is a physiological environment factor associated with several diseases due to the cellular toxic effects on many different tissues via acetaldehyde. Acetaldehyde interferes with DNA synthesis and DNA repair system, noted for the underlying effects of lower and upper gastrointestinal tract cancers. Alcohol induces oxidative stress on the liver and other organs, also impairs one-carbon metabolism that regulates availability of methyl groups, resulting in abnormal methyl group transfer thought to the development of various cancers and other associated diseases.

Alcohol has effect on epigenetics via the one-carbon metabolism and DNA methylation that effects gene expressions by modification of the phenotype without alteration of the DNA base sequencing. DNA methylation alters the methyl group of

the 5'-carbon of cytosine the occurs at CpG, in dinucleotide sequence in mammalian genome.

DNA methyltransferases (DNMTs) maintains DNMT1 which preserves DNA methylation levels during cellular mitosis. DNMT3A and DNMT3B regulate cytosine methylation sites (Boland M.J.Christman J.K(2009), DNA methylation has a physiological role in normalization of chromosomal imprinting. Thus alcohol interferes with vitamin folate absorption via inhabitation of the one-carbon metabolism directly; folate, a water soluble vitamin B availability is diminish by alcohol intake an intestinal malabsorption thus increased renal excretion due to deficiency of folate or vitamin B9 (Hamid, A. and Kaur, J(2007).

Epigenetic effects of alcohol on the physiology and many associated diseases all occur via mechanisms of DNA methylation and alcohol induced histone modifications on the histone-tail sites, resultant abnormal DNA methylation that has tissue and gene specificity which easily also influenced by diet, age, and genotype in concordance to biomarkers and quantitatively alcohol consumption. Thus, it is reasonable to say alcohol is not advisable (also see appendixes).


Caffeine nutrigenetics

Caffeine is a central nervous system (CNS) stimulant of the methylxanthine class (methylxan-thine alkaloid - 1,3,7-trimethyl xanthine), and isochemically related to the purine adenine and guanine bases of (DNA) and (RNA). Caffeine is contained in seeds, nuts, and leaves of various plants native, most abundant source of caffeine is the seed of Coffee plants, belonging to the botanical family of Rubiaceae, two main species are Coffee arabica and Coffee canephora Caffeine-containing drinks, coffee, tea, and cola, coffee is most frequently used beverage worldwide; caffeine alleviates drowsiness and improves alertness and is the most widely consumed and guite legal mild stimulant.

Caffeine is absorbed through the gastrointestinal tract and metabolized in the liver by cytochrome P450 1A2 (CYP1A2), with resultant metabolites: paraxanthine, theophylline, and bromine. Caffeine levels appear in the bloodstream within 15-45 min, in 1 hour post ingestion of consumption, crossing the blood brain barrier due to its lipid solubility and makes changes in the cerebral fluid via synaptic enzymic activity. Caffeine and metabolites are excreted by the kidneys, and concentrations decrease by 50%-75% within 3-6 hour of consumption.

The main mechanism are adenosine receptor antagonism and secondary effect is inhibition of phosphodiesterase, with accumulation of cyclic AMP and an intensification of the effects of catechol-amines, effects are cognitive response, © copyright (2021) John Lawrence King All Rights Reserved 29/04/21

Many caffeine stimulant effects are mediated by adenosine receptor sub types A1 and A2A, both expressed and differently distributed in human brain, important in sleep-wake regulation (Svenningsson et al., 1997), caffeine acts on the CNS as an adenosine antagonist, though also has effect on substrate metabolism and neuromuscular function (Goldstein et al., 2010). The mechanism of functional foods and positive intellectual attitude on epigenetics is via **Quantum field biological interactions** (also see figure 1e - Feynman




diagram). Figure 1g - Feynman diagram, (there are an infinite number of Feynman diagrams that are graphical representations of equations).

Telomeres are age related effectors with respect to quantitative cellular replication, and therefore ageing and biological DNA repair system. Each time cell division occurs, the telomeres 'tips' at the end of chromosome diminish as nucleotides erode of the DNA structure and the telomere shortens each cell division, approximately hundred nucleotide telomere repeats must be at the end of chromosome to avoid activation of the biological DNA repair pathways; researchers at Stanford University have developed a new procedure to lengthen chromosomal telomeres, effectively quantitatively increasing cellular division by preventing shortening of the chromosomal 'tips' and extending the biological clock of cellular ageing process; Also Astragalus root have been studied as possible telomerase activators such an extract is TA-65 and vitamin D3 (fish oils) have similar effects of biological clock extension via telomere extension.

The "flow-FISH" test stands for flow cytometry and fluorescence in situ hybridization, that specifically measures the telomere length via blood sample, the flow-FISH test was developed by Canadian researcher Lansdorp, P., (2006) M.D.,Ph. Stress can diminish telomerase activities thereby shortening the biological clock, the opposite is true for individuals with high telomerase of which adds telomeres thereby extension of biological age via extension of quantitative cellular life, with additional telomeres towards optimal health and healthy ageing (or anti-ageing).





The opposite biological reaction is called deacetylation that removes the acetyl group. Acetylation can alter gene expression epigenetically. $(\cap$

Crotonylation is a reversible modification via crotonyl transferases (writers) and decrotonylases (erasers). Crotonylation has overlapped acyl-transferases and de-acylases with acetylation and other types of histone acylations at site 25, 30 and also overlapped modification sites on histones at 29, 31. additional epigenetic modification on histones, crotonylation also occurs in histone proteins 25, 26, 27, 28 and participates metabolic pathways such as acetylation 29 on the histone complex. Citrullination is a facilitator modifying known "self-antigens" to foreign, unrecognized proteins, vulnerable immunity. Citrullination is a general regulatory mechanism that occurs during apoptosis; Citrullination is also part of normal physiology, for example, citrullination of trichohyalin in the hair follicle, myelin basic protein, histones in the nucleus, and keratin in the nails and skin.

HAT - Histone acetyltransferases catalyse the transfer of an acetyl group from acetyl coenzyme A, while histone deacetylases (HDAC) perform the antagonistic state of removing the acetyl group. Histone acetylation has an important role in the modulation of chromatin condensation and transcriptional regulation.

HDAC are enzymes which remove acetyl groups from lysine residues in the tail region of histone/octamer complexes or nucleosomes. Through this mechanism, HDAC are involved in the modification of chromatin architecture and govern the repression of oncogenes, tumour suppressors, and inflammatory genes (de Ruijter et al., 2003), garlic contains 40-60% DADS (Diallyl Disulfide).

Histone-tail modifications - Histone-tail modifications are transactional epigenetics that undergo events via - acetylation, phosphorylation, or methylation, these three are necessary to allow the activity of the chromatin remodelling complex. Methylation activates or represses gene expression depending on which residue is methylated; Methylation of histone methyltransferases (HMTs), of Lysine SET domain containing (histone tails) and Non-SET domain containing (histone core octamer)

Histone acetylation – occurs on the ε -amino lysine residue and promotes DNA unfolding – CoA (acetyl coenzyme A) and lysine where HAT (histone acetyltransferase enzyme, inhibits gene expression - i.e. repression for immunological defence) and HDAC (histone deacetylase enzyme. HDAC enables nucleic gene expression), n-butyrate is a HDAC inhibitor where HATs are co-activators during transcription. HATs categories are: GCN5. Histone methylation cause local formation of chromatin, which is reversible also can activate or suppress gene expression in accordance to different lysine dependent states (i.e. Mono-methyl, Di-methyl, or Trimethyl (binds the DNA coils around the octamers); The demethylated function is in reverse releasing the DNA coils during transcription. There are **seven** transcriptional regulatory core histone modifications on the 3 histone-tail that is:- 2 active promoters (**H3K9ac**, **H3K4me3**), 2 enhancer promoters (**H3K4me1** (stem cell line), **H3K27ac**), 1 transcribed gene bodies (**H3K36me3**), 1 polycomb promoters(**H3K27me3**), 1 heterochromatin (**H3K9me3**) it is possible to define chromatin profile states(marks) of the genome via the seven histone-tail modification marker state (see acetylation, histone acetylation, HATs, HDAC, and figure 1a, 1b and figure 1d) **Histone modifications** – mark transcriptional events that are ether – active, repressed, or poised states (see figure 1d).

Isomerization - Isomerism definition is compounds which have same molecular formula but differ in reverse arrangement of atoms known as isomers classification of isomerism. There are two main types of isomerism: - structural isomerism and stereoisomerism.

Immunity - The ability of an organism to resist a particular infection or toxin by the action of specific antibodies or hypersensitive white blood cells.

Lysine methylation – enable transcriptional regulatory binding sites for core histone modificatory co-activators on histone tails (see histone methylation).

Methylation - A chemical reaction in which a methyl group (CH_3 -) is introduced in a molecule. A particular example is the replacement of a hydrogen atom by a methyl group DNA methylation is a common molecular alteration in colorectal cancer cells.

Microbiota – (microfauna and microflora) The smallest organisms, comprising

Bacteria, Fungi, and algae. Microbiota are found in the lungs, stomach, intestinal tract and colon.

Neutron consist of 1 up quark and 2 down quarks. Also, an elementary particle that has no charge, with a mass slightly greater than that of a proton, and spin of a $\frac{1}{2}$, a component of the nuclei of all atoms except those of hydrogen (see quark & protons).

Nucleosome core complex is made from an octamer that is a eight histone protein complex, at the centre of a nucleosome consists of two copies of the four core histone proteins (H2A, H2B, H3 and H4), involved in chromatin folding and co-factor recruitment (see figure 1a, 1b, 1d).

OGT - O-GICNacylation – enzymic post-translational regulator with TET2 interactions to produce hydroxy methyl cytosine regulating transcription.

Phenotype is the total physical gene expression, different genotypes may result from different Phenotype, mutations can cause changes in phenotype.

Positive intellectual attitude - an approach that can be advantageous towards optimal health, i.e., healthy-lifestyle-choices towards exercise and intake of healthy nutrition (also see figure 1c - Feynman diagram and Quantum) field biological interactions and functional foods on epigenetics).

Phosphorylation - is a biochemical process that involves addition of phosphate to an organic compound. Examples are the addition of phosphate to glucose producing glucose monophosphate with addition of phosphate to adenosine diphosphate (ADP) to form adenosine triphosphate (ATP). Phosphorylation is carried out utilising the enzyme phosphotransferases or kinases. Phosphorylated gH2AX is a protein that accumulates at sites of DNA breaks, detection via fluorescent antibodies that is used to determine the quantity of DNA strand breaks within a nucleus Phosphorylation regulates ubiquitylation.

PRMT - Protein arginine methyltransferases – mediate protein(s) substrate methylation of arginine residues, involved in T-lymphocyte activation and gluconeogenesis.

Proton - a proton is a subatomic stable particle with mass defined as positive charge made from three quarks (2 up & 1 down). The atomic number is the

number of protons within an atom, the nucleus of every atom contains protons, both protons and neutrons are found in the atom (see guark & neutron).

Ubiguitylation – (or ubiguitination) is an enzymatic process involves the bonding of a ubiquitin protein to a substrate protein, Ubiquitin contains conserved sequence of 76 amino acids and linked via covalently bonded proteins proteasomes that promotes apoptosis of the cell; the ubiquitous protein proteasomes are present in all eukaryotic cells. Ubiguitylation regulated posttranslational modification of proteins of ubiquitin molecule, attached to a lysine amino acid in the **Degradation** of p53 promoted by E3 ubiquitin ligase ITCH via ubiguitylation at the N-terminal border of SAM (methyl group donor) domain of the p53 [alpha] isoforms; the process of ubiquitination can be reversed through the action of deubiguitinase enzymes, by altering the bond between ubiquitin molecule and substrate protein (see phosphorylation).

repression – inhibits epigenome gene expression, the epigenome defence mechanism (ability to switch genes off and on) that co-evolved within invertebrates.

SAM - S-Adenosyl-methionine is a methyl group donor, a substrate that product is SAH.

SAH - S-adenosylhomocysteine - a protein that has a product of SAH into homocysteine and adenosine.

SIRT1 – Sirtuins - see Appendix ID

Serotonylation is a receptor independent signalling mechanism, a process for exocytosis of thrombocytes of the blood platelets via serotonlyation of small GTPases such as Rab4 and RhoA. Serotonylation activates of serotonin 5hydroxytryptamine (that is a neurotransmitter) during intracellular processes that have lasting effects of covalent bonds within enzymes. The enzymes attach to the serotonin on glutamine residues, this signalling mechanism utilizes transglutaminase antibody enzyme for the creation of glutamylamide bonds. Serotonylation is through small GTPases the process by which serotonin controls release of pancreatic insulin from beta cells for the regulation of blood glucose levels. Thus, defects in transglutaminase lead to glucose intolerance, small GTPases are involved, and also regulate vascular aorta smooth muscles. serotonylation modifying proteins are also integral to cytoskeleton via alphaactin, beta-actin, gamma-actin and myosin heavy chains. Serotonin is also a

Small GTPases - are tightly regulated molecular switches that make binary on/off through controlled usage of GTP activation and hydrolysis of GTP to GDP that is inactivation.

Subconscious is part of the mind that controls involuntary movement and automatic-immunity.....whilst a higher percentage the brain is functioning on alpha waves; the conscious is part of the mind that controls voluntary movement and conscious thoughts, whilst mostly higher percentage functioning on beta waves, though there are other measurable wave frequencies.

Supersymmetry is an extension of the Standard Model that predicts a partner particle (referred to as anti-matter) for each particle in the Standard Model (see Standard Model)

Standard Model – a mathematical description of the elementary particles (of fields) of matter and electromagnetic, weak, and strong forces by which they interact (see Supersymmetry).

Sumoylation, is a post-translational modification that attaches the SUMO protein to intended proteins regulating activity, function, subcellular localization and stability (Sumoylation Inhibits TAK-981)

Synthetic biology – A scientific field that draws on principles of engineering to create new biological parts, devices, or systems to redesign or improve natural biological systems; The capability to make DNA polymers with specific base sequences that behave as genes. These DNA polymers consist of various small DNA sequences that are programmed together (via amino acid, DNA or protein computational program compilers) by homologous recombination to produce functional genes with required genomic and epigenetic health benefit properties to achieve healthy ageing or age reversal (Synthetic biology is also used with mice, yeast, bacteria and fungi).

Ten-eleven transferase (TET) enzymes – TET1 or TET2 is found in the embryonic stem cells, while TET3 is found in the stem cells; the TETs are expressed ubiquitously in differentiated cells, (TET1) is a DNA demethylation enzyme associated with tumorigenesis and biological process via catalysis and hydroxylation of DNA (5-methylcytosine (5mC) to 5-hydroxymethylcytosine (5hmC), further catalyze oxidation of 5hmC to 5-formylcytosine (5fC) and then to 5-carboxycytosine (5caC). There are interactions between TET, active DNA

demethylation (of DNA base cytosine), transcription, genomic instability, and the DNA damage/repair response.

Telomeres are protective tips at the ends of chromosomes, during cellular division, the tips shorten and over time, the telomeres become too short to sustain cell division and the cell become senescent. Other influences include age, stress, poor lifestyle choices and exposure to environmental toxins, it is essential to maintain telomere length. Telomerase is naturally occurring enzyme that lengthens telomeres and prevents shortening thereby extending the biological clock with telomere extension therapeutic techniques.

THF - Tetrahydrofolate - one-carbon group carrier involved in amino and nucleic acid biosynthesis and thymidine precursor in synthetic pathways

Quark - any of a number of subatomic particles carrying a fractional electric charge, it takes three quarks (1 up 2 down held together by gluons) to make a proton (see proton & neutron).

There is a substantial relationship between nutrition and functional foods with healthy ageing, functional foods convey to consumers the associated characteristics and nutritional health benefits. All foods are functional, though functional foods and Bio-functional-foods provide more health benefits than basic nutrition.
